

Look out for Curlews

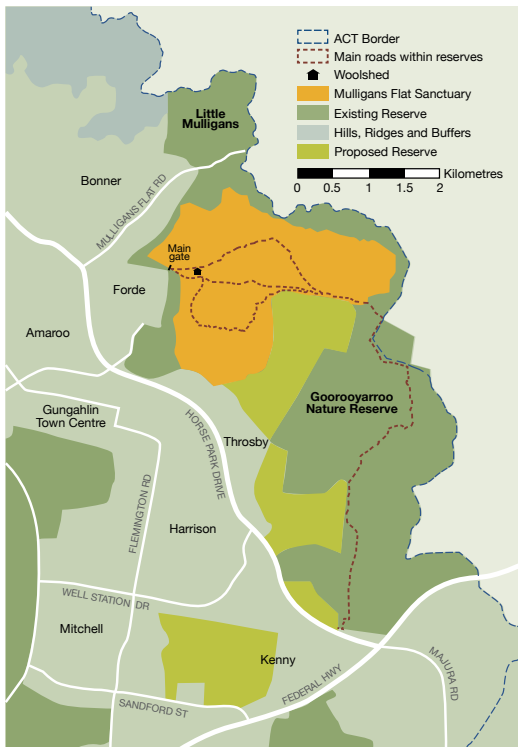


We are bringing back Bush Stone-curlews, a bird not seen in the ACT for nearly 50 years. Help us by reporting any sightings, using this postcard.

Bush Stone-curlews are large, ground living birds which rest amongst tussock grass, leaf litter, logs or fallen timber during the day. At night they come out to feed and you may hear them calling.

Once found across much of Australia's woodlands, they have declined in the south-east due to clearing of habitat and being eaten by introduced predators such as foxes and cats.
